Aldersgate Special Needs

*“My people will live in peaceful dwellings places, in secure homes, in
undisturbed places of rest.” Isaiah 32:18*

August 8 has been designated by the SC Conference as Aldersgate Sunday. Aldersgate Special Needs Ministry was founded to provide homes where adults with developmental disabilities can live in a Christian environment, overseen by a dedicated staff.

The need is great! At this time, in the state of SC there are approximately 2,000 people with special needs on the waiting list for housing. Many of these people live with aging parents who are struggling to care for their adult son or daughter with special needs.

Aldersgate's two homes, one in Columbia near Epworth Children's Home and one in Orangeburg at the Methodist Oaks, have just celebrated their first full year in operation. It has been a year full of challenges and many blessings.

There is much work yet to be done, and it is especially challenging during these distressed economic times. Your support can help this needed ministry continue to become a reality for adults with developmental disabilities and their families. Aldersgate does NOT receive funding from the United Methodist Church through apportionments.

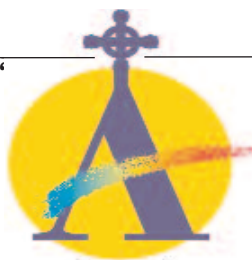

Going Green

Tips from Shandon's Green Team

Recycling Plastic Bags and Plastic Wrap — Keeping Up With The Rules!

Each person uses about 350 plastic bags a year and only 1% are recycled. Only about 12% of our plastic bags and plastic wrap are now recycled.

Plastic bags and plastic wrap are not recycled at curbside. We must recycle them at local grocery/retail stores. Such store recycling programs started out by accepting only #2 plastic bags. Now plastic bag recycling programs at many stores have expanded to include #4 plastic bags such as produce bags, newspaper bags, dry cleaner bags, and bread bags. Also #4 plastic wrap used for paper towels, toilet tissue, paper plates, napkins, diapers, and plastic case wrap for cases of beverages are also accepted by many stores. Your local Publix and Kroger stores accept all #2 and #4 plastic bags and wrap. Check with your local store policy concerning plastic bag and plastic wrap recycling.

Be sure all plastic bags and wrap are clean and dry and free of receipts. Do not include bags with handles or drawstrings, prepackaged frozen food bags, compostable bags, or any cling wrap such as Saran Wrap.
