Envisioning our Future

From the Senior Minister

Our Church Council recently made the decision that it is time for Shandon to engage in a process of strategic planning.

Having completed the expansion of our church campus through our recent building and renovation program, it is time for us now to envision our future and discern God's will for our church's ministry for the coming years. This can be an exciting process and we want to give every member of our church an opportunity to participate. As the prophet, Joel, proclaimed in chapter 2 verses 28-29, "I will pour out my spirit..., your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams and your sons shall see visions."

Our church has contracted with Pinnacle Leadership Associates to lead us in a process of discernment. Our consultant will be Mark Tidsworth, president of Pinnacle.

The process will begin on March 13 when we will commission our members in all three worship services to a process of discernment. We will commission ourselves to a period of discernment seeking God's calling. We will commit ourselves to a season of prayer using daily devotional material that will be offered to every member. We will identify our core values, longstanding themes, and ministry strengths. We will do an assessment of our ministry context seeking to understand the community we are called to serve. We will gather in small groups to identify the future vision of our life together and ministry. We will identify goals and objectives with an action plan. Then we will commit ourselves to the vision and celebrate God's future for Shandon.

I hope you will participate in every aspect of this process and commit yourself fully to it. More details will follow in upcoming mailings, articles in *The Voice* and announcements in our bulletin.

Let us all be in prayer that God will lead us to an eventful and exciting future.
I look forward to seeing you Sunday morning!

These letters are found in Revelation 2:1-3:22. All the letters carry a call to repentance for particular sins found in each church. This call to repentance is fitting for the season of Lent. The sermon series will begin on March 6 the Sunday prior to Ash Wednesday. The schedule for the sermon series is as follows:

- **Letter to the church at Ephesus:** Revelation 2:1-7 – The church that had forsaken its first love.
- **Letter to the church at Smyrna:** Revelation 2:8-11 – The church that was spiritually impoverished.
- **Letter to the church at Pergamum:** Revelation 2:12-17 – The church that was surrounded by temptation.
- **Letter to the church at Thyatira:** Revelation 2:18-29 – The church that listens to a false prophetess.
- **Letter to the church at Sardis:** Revelations 3:1-6 – The church that has fallen asleep.
- **Letter to the church at Philadelphia:** Revelations 3:7-13 – The church that had endured patiently.
- **Letter to the church at Laodicea:** Revelations 3:14-22 – The church with a lukewarm faith.

Shandon's Child & Youth Abuse Prevention Procedures: Reminder of the Month: "Reporting Suspected Abuse" (Refer to p. 4-IV. of the Child and Youth Prevention Policy for full report & response procedures)

- Anyone associated with Shandon UMC who observes abuse, or has reason to suspect abuse, should immediately report these observations or suspicions directly to the Shandon UMC clergyperson or staff director of the relevant program. The Senior Minister should be immediately contacted and will be personally responsible for executing the initial response procedures. Individuals involved in reporting should not confront the subject of the allegation. Confidentiality for both the alleged victim and the accused should be observed throughout the investigation. The Senior Minister will be the church's sole spokesman with the media, public, and congregation.

Going Green

Tips from Shandon's Green Team

A Reminder: How To Dispose Of Common Household Batteries

American households are using more batteries every year. About 3 billion batteries are bought each year – that's about 32 per household. Some 24 are discarded by each household annually. Many batteries are being recycled properly, however, many are not. With all the different types of batteries we use today in our homes, here is a reminder of the general rules for their safe disposal. Remember, it's the law!

The common single use alkaline and carbon zinc batteries are safe for disposal in the normal curbside municipal trash. These batteries may come in AAA, AA, C, D, 6v, and 9v sizes.

However, all button cell and rechargeable batteries of varied sizes are considered hazardous waste and must be disposed of through a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Site. These batteries contain mercury, cadmium, lead, lithium, and other toxic materials. A range of municipal and retail store battery recycling collection sites are available, and most retail stores selling electronic devices accept batteries for proper disposal.

Proper battery recycling prevents toxic metals from contaminating our landfill, water, and air.
