Visit the Holy Land

I have always dreamed of going to the Holy Land and walking where Jesus walked. I have dreamed of seeing the places he traveled and carried out his ministry.

I am considering a trip to the Holy Land for either late February or early May 2012. I would like to make this a Shandon Methodist trip if there are enough of our members interested in going. This would be either a 10 or 14 day trip depending on which tour company we use. There are two tour companies I am talking with to tell me that this would be a safe trip, and they have been taking tour groups every year. The tour price would include accommodations at either first class or four star hotels with modern comforts, breakfast and dinner each day, a tour guide, motor coach and all transfers, entrance fees to sites on our itinerary, and air fare. So the tour is all inclusive with the cost varying between the two tour companies.

This trip would focus on the life and ministry of Jesus and take us to historical sites where he carried out his ministry. There would be lectures at most sites.

In exploring the potential for this trip, I have first contacted those who took Disciple Bible Study and Jesus and the Gospels this past year to see what the interest level might be. I have heard from 10 church members who say they are interested. Now that it appears we have enough interest, I want to open this opportunity to all church members who might be interested.

If you are interested in taking a Holy Land trip, I invite you to attend a meeting on June 29 at 6:30 p.m. in Wesley Hall. I will have brochures available for you to preview, including a fact sheet with itemized cost. If you are unable to attend the meeting, please give me a call at the church at 256-8383, ext. 103 and I will fill you in on the details. It would be great to have a group of Shandon members with which to share this tour.

I hope to see all of you in worship on Sunday morning. Sunday is Father's Day, and we will focus on the family in our worship.
