Building Committee

The final meeting of the Building Committee was held on April 26th.

With a time span of eleven years a tremendous amount of work has been accomplished, and in addition to the new building for infants and toddlers, every existing building on campus has been dramatically renovated to meet the growing needs of our membership. Our goal from the beginning was to equip our entire campus for the present and for future generations, and that goal has been met.

There are many people to thank for this magnificent outcome. First and foremost, the generous members of our church who supported it through two financial campaigns and continue to pay on those pledges, and to others who have made significant non-pledged gifts. Our success could not have happened except for this support.

Next, our loyal church staff, which has borne with such grace the inconvenience of having work going on in their midst. This has gone on year after year, and they have really been truly remarkable.

The Administrative Board, later replaced by the Church Council, has been encouraging at every point. The Finance Committee, while not responsible for the project, was unfailingly supportive of decisions made by the Building Committee.

The architects from the Boudreaux Group who worked over each detail with us responded to every need. Contractors, chosen by bids, provided the highest quality product, working with us on a daily basis to assure that the work was well done. Various other providers stayed with us until every issue was satisfied.

The Building Committee, selected by the Nominating Committee to begin the project in 2000, from space assessment all the way until completion of all of the project, has worked tirelessly and devotedly to achieve the best outcome possible. The difficulties with approval of our plans through neighborhood issues and the city regulation and approval process are mostly forgotten in the realization of how valuable the venture is in serving God and His people.

The Charge Conference, called by the Columbia District Superintendent, which has final approval of funds for building projects, approved our total plan some years ago and allowed us to run a debt not to exceed \$1.7 million. As we conclude the work, there remains a debt of approximately \$1,400,000 to be paid off before we are in the clear. We are so grateful the entire campus could be transformed and essential new spaces added while incurring this comparatively modest debt for a church our size. We strongly encourage completion of pledges, as well as asking all members for continued donations to help with paying off the remainder.

God is astoundingly good. We have sought His counsel throughout this protracted but holy endeavor, and He has answered our prayers.

Tips from Shandon's Green Team

Electronic Waste Recycling and the Law

In 2009, more than **53,800** tons of e-waste was generated in South Carolina – yet only **3%** was recycled.

South Carolina became the **22nd** state, to enact legislation which was signed by Governor Sanford last year, making it unlawful for certain electronic items to be placed in landfills in our state. Effective **July 1, 2011**, it will be unlawful for desktop and laptop computers, computer monitors, printers, and televisions to be placed in landfills. They are now required to be recycled at designated e-waste drop-off locations.

The law represents a simple recognition that we are Stewards of God's Creation and, as a consequence, we must make efforts to protect it.

Shandon's Child & Youth Abuse Prevention Procedures REMINDER OF THE MONTH: "REPORTING SUSPECTED ABUSE"

(Refer to p. 4-IV. of the Child and Youth Prevention
Policy for full report & response procedures)

Anyone associated with Shandon UMC who observes abuse, or has reason to suspect abuse, should immediately report these observations or suspicions directly to the Shandon UMC clergy person or staff director of the relevant program, and in their absence, to the Senior Minister or, in his absence, to another SUMC clergy person. The Senior Minister or Acting Senior Minister should be immediately contacted and will be personally responsible for executing the initial response procedures. Individuals involved in reporting should not confront the subject of the allegation.

Confidentiality for both the alleged victim and the accused should be observed throughout the investigation. The Senior Minister will be the church's sole spokesman with the media, public, and congregation.

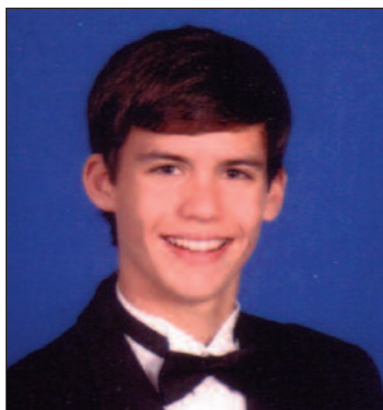
