## PROCESSIONAL CROSS CONSECRATION

**We consecrated the new Processional Cross in our Sanctuary Services on June 17.**

**The Cross derives inspiration from modern Coptic Crosses.**

The premise of Coptic Cross design is the triangular face at each end of the cross representing the Trinity of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. From a front or rear view, the cross has twelve points symbolizing the Apostles whose mission was to spread the Gospel message throughout the world. The Cross is set over a wooden orb known as “globus crucifer” translated as Christ’s dominion over the world. The United Methodist Church is truly a global church and it is fitting to illustrate the church’s worldwide ministry by showing the cross over the orb in this historical fashion. The Cross, orb and pole are constructed of basswood, beech wood, and white ash, with the finished assembly weighing only four pounds. The Cross is gilded in 24 carat gold leaf with an antique finish and the pole is finished to match other woods in the Sanctuary.

The Processional Cross was designed by Phillip Alexander Warren, Project Manager, Boomerang Design (an architectural firm with offices in Lexington, SC and Shelby, Charlotte, Raleigh, NC); and constructed by Lewtak Pipe Organ Builders in Mocksville, NC.
