A Look...

AT RECENT UMC CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS.

THE FUNDAMENTAL CONSTITUTING AND LEGAL DOCUMENT OF THE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH IS ITS CONSTITUTION. APPROVED IN 1968, IT ESTABLISHES THE BASIC OUTLINE FOR THE ORGANIZATION OF OUR DENOMINATION.

In 2016, five amendments to the Constitution were approved by the General Conference in Portland, Oregon. The General Conference is our primary legislative body which typically meets every four years. To be ratified, these amendments also required a two-thirds approval of the aggregate vote among Annual Conference delegates worldwide.

On May 7, 2018, the results on all five amendments were published. Three of the amendments were ratified. However, two amendments failed to receive enough votes by a slim margin. These two amendments directly engaged women's equality. Amendment One sought to include in the Constitution a new paragraph on the equality of women and men. It received 66.5% of worldwide votes in-favor, less than 100 votes shy of the required threshold. The South Carolina Conference voted 643 "yes" and 357 "no" on Amendment One. Amendment Two sought to expand an existing paragraph on Inclusiveness in the Church, by adding "gender," "ability," "age," and "marital status" to the list of protected membership descriptors. Amendment Two received 61.3% votes in-favor worldwide. The South Carolina Conference voted 505 "yes" and 487 "no" on Amendment Two.

Interpreting these votes reveals the tension that United Methodists live in regarding women's equality. On one hand, we are a leading Christian denomination related to women's rights. For 60+ years, we have consecrated female missionaries, preachers, and bishops. Our dedication to women's ordination is codified in The Book of Discipline and our Social Principles, along with many provisions for the full participation of women. We uphold the Biblical witness that "There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus" (Galatians 3:28). On the other hand, discrimination against women and girls continues in every part of the world today, including the UMC. Despite our doctrinal statements and policies, female laity and clergy still experience injustice and harassment.

Within this tension, some perceive the failure of Amendments One and Two as another tragic shortcoming in the effort to address women's equality. For others, votes against these amendments are not necessarily votes against women's rights, but merely one step in the process of honing our Constitution into its best possible language. What is sure is that future General Conferences will have a chance to revisit these topics. Thus, we must rest on God's grace, and the leading of the Holy Spirit, in the living, breathing, ongoing work of discerning who we are as United Methodists together.
