GRADUATE SUNDAY

Celebrating the upcoming graduation of our 2018 High School Seniors.

On Sunday, May 13, high school seniors will be recognized in 8:45 a.m. worship and enjoy a brunch with their families in Player Hall immediately following the service.

This is a special day in the lives of these youth as well as within the life of our church. At the time of their 6th grade confirmation in 2012, this was the largest confirmation class our church has embraced. As they look toward new opportunities, we will continue to support them in their faith journeys. We encourage them to broaden their minds and experiences, and remain faithful to a life of Christian discipleship.

Nine years ago a California pastor named Francis Chan penned a book called The Forgotten God. 46 years ago Anglican bishop and theologian John V. Taylor wrote a book called The Go-Between God. What do these two books, written a generation apart by men who lived halfway around the world from each other, have in common? They are both about the Holy Spirit. And, as the titles indicate, the overarching theme of each book is that the Holy Spirit is the least known, least understood person of the Trinity.



Though some Christian traditions place more emphasis on the Holy Spirit than others – Pentecostalism is an obvious example – Chan and Taylor certainly have their fingers on the pulse of American United Methodists. Pentecost Sunday should be one of the greatest days of the year for us – ranking right

alongside Christmas, Holy Week, and Easter. My fear, however, is that on many of our late spring calendars, it falls well behind Mother's Day, graduation, and the end of school!

If it makes us feel any better, the Spirit seems to have been the “forgotten God” even in the days of the early church. You may have noticed, for example, that while the Apostles’ Creed devotes a short paragraph to God the Father and a long paragraph to God the Son, its third paragraph simply says, “We believe in the Holy Spirit.” The Nicene Creed has slightly more to say, but not much.

Who is this mysterious third person of the Trinity? The chapter titles and sub-titles of Clark Pinnock’s book *Flame of Love* (written between Taylor and Chan) provide a helpful summary ...

- ***Spirit and Trinity:*** The face of the Spirit in the communion of the Holy Trinity
- ***Spirit in Creation:*** The Spirit as Lord and giver of life, who touches creation and moves it toward completion
- ***Spirit and Christology:*** The Spirit anointed Jesus of Nazareth to heal human brokenness from the inside and bring about atonement
- ***Spirit and Church:*** The Spirit indwells the church and is present sacramentally and charismatically to endow it for mission
- ***Spirit and Union:*** The goal of salvation is to live in loving union with God and to participate in the triune nature through the Spirit
- ***Spirit and Universality:*** God desires all to be saved and is found graciously present with every person in every place by the Spirit
- ***Spirit and Truth:*** The Spirit leads the church into truth along the path of mission, enabling it to be timely and fruitful in ministry



May 20 is Pentecost Sunday. May it be a day of great celebration and rejoicing – the day when we celebrate the outpouring of the Spirit on the first disciples of Jesus, and the Spirit’s continuing presence in the church and world!

Disaster Recovery

ON FEBRUARY 23 AND 24, SHANDON MEMBERS JOINED TOGETHER WITH SOUTH CAROLINA UNITED METHODIST DISASTER RECOVERY MINISTRIES TO PUT THE FINISHING TOUCHES ON THREE HOMES IN THE COLUMBIA AREA.

Helping others in need. You can help.

These homes suffered damages in the Flood of 2015 and Hurricane Matthew in 2016 and are part of the approximately 151,000 South Carolina families who sought assistance from FEMA, though only about 39,500 received any assistance.

Some of the work included putting up a ceiling fan, mudding, sanding, scraping, priming and painting of walls and ceilings, repair of a deck, trimming of multiple doors swollen by water and unable to close, removal of paneling and mold with replacement of paneling and trim, as well as painting, and repair of a roof. South Carolina Disaster Recovery is actively involved in 17 of the 24 counties affected by the 2015 Flood and Hurricane Matthew. They project that they will be engaged in disaster recovery through 2018 as hundreds of South Carolina families are still in need of help. Individual volunteers and teams are desperately needed to complete the work and workdays can be arranged for one day, several days, or a week at a time, and although skills in construction and home repair are a plus, no skills are required to volunteer.
