A Saint?

NOVEMBER 1 IS ALL SAINTS' DAY ON THE CHRISTIAN CALENDAR.

*They love to do
Jesus' will.*

Often when we hear the word "saint" we think of larger-than-life saints like Patrick, Francis, and Mother Teresa. But Lesbia Scott's lovely hymn (below) reminds us that saints come in all shapes and sizes. In fact, there are many wonderful saints who have never been given the official title "saint."

*I sing a song of the saints of God, patient and brave and true,
Who toiled and fought and lived and died for the Lord they loved and knew.
And one was a doctor, and one was a queen, and one was a shepherdess on the green;
They were all of them saints of God, and I mean, God helping to be one too.*

*They loved their Lord so dear, so dear, and his love made them strong;
And they followed the right for Jesus' sake the whole of their good lives long.
And one was a soldier, and one was a priest, and one was slain by a fierce wild beast;
And there's not any reason, no, not the least, why I shouldn't be one too.*

*They lived not only in ages past; there are hundreds of thousands still.
The world is bright with the joyous saints who love to do Jesus' will.
You can meet them in school, on the street, in the store,
in church, by the sea, in the house next door;
they are saints of God, whether rich or poor, and I mean to be one too.*

One person whom I would nominate as an untitled saint from our Methodist family is Harriet Tubman. By no means a saint in any traditional sense, Tubman was a runaway slave who led dozens to freedom on the Underground Railroad. One of her most famous exploits occurred in South Carolina. She helped lead a raid to free slaves from several plantations on the Combahee River – where today the US 17 bridge crosses the Combahee. Only five feet tall, Tubman became known as the "Moses of her people." She always carried a gun with her – not only to ward off Southern posses, but also to threaten any escaping slave who might begin to "chicken out." In the late 19th century Tubman joined the crusade for women's suffrage and became a very devoted member of the AME Zion church. (By the way, for you moviegoers, a new movie about Tubman, called "Harriet," opens on November 1.)

So the categories of saints are limitless – from Mother Teresa to Harriet Tubman and everything in between. I simply leave you with the question Scott's hymn raises – why shouldn't you be one, too?

Our current logo and brand identity were developed by working with an established local creative marketing firm. The firm conducted a marketing study with both church members and the community, and based on the findings, put together a brand identity for Shandon. Over the years, our communication materials have been created to build on and enhance this brand identity.

The firm identified Shandon as a dynamic, energetic congregation with a depth of programming and found that every individual who comes to Shandon, no matter what age or background, finds countless opportunities for spiritual growth that seem limitless. This is one of the many things that makes Shandon unique. Shandon's brand identity was developed around the faith journey and the essence of "discovery."

Over the past several months, the Communications Committee has been revisiting our brand identity and messages as well as reviewing our website to ensure they continue to be relevant and effective. Through discussions with several marketing/website firms and currently working directly with a firm, we are in the process of refreshing Shandon's visual brand identity and messages.

The core of the logo remains the same.

- The vertical curving line is a path that represents a spiritual journey; and extends beyond the horizon, which shows no end.
- The horizontal line is the horizon and forms the cross.
- The circle symbol presents an image that is friendly and approachable.
- The colors are fresh.
- The typestyle for "Shandon" is distinctive.
- The typestyle for "United Methodist" is contemporary.
