“GOOD TO GREAT” – THAT IS THE TITLE OF A BEST-SELLING BOOK ON BUSINESS AND LEADERSHIP.



It is also the theme of our 2019 stewardship emphasis, which we’re calling “Imagine Shandon.” We are blessed. Many things at Shandon are good. Some things are very good. Can you imagine them being great?

On our “Imagine Shandon” signs around the church, you won’t actually see the word “great.” What you will see are the words “immeasurably more.” Those words come from the NIV translation of Ephesians 3:20 (see below). In context these words remind us that God is infinitely great and good, and God wants to do “immeasurably more” in and through us.

We asked several Shandon members what this might look like. I hope you’ll check out their responses on social media: @shandonumc or Shandon United Methodist Church. The most common theme in what they said was – spoiler alert! – “participation.” Don’t just be a fan – get in the game. Make church a 52-weeks-a-year part of your life. Take full advantage of what Shandon has to offer you – friendship, worship, learning, and service. Give God the first fruit – not the leftovers – of your time, talent, and treasure. Or, as my Clemson friends like to say, “All in!”

Please prayerfully “Imagine Shandon” in general and yourself in particular. Imagine how God is calling us to do and be “immeasurably more” as disciples of Jesus and servants of God’s kingdom!

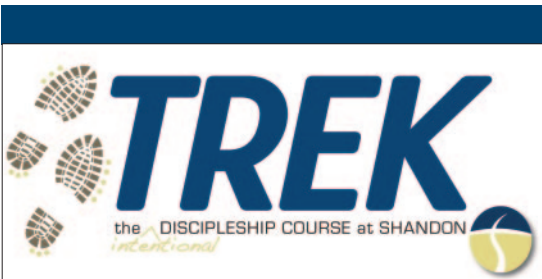

Prior to working with children, each staff person or volunteer is required to:

- Be a regular participant in our congregation for a minimum of six months
- Complete forms and background checks as per the regulations of the church's policies
- Complete an initial training in the church's Child Abuse Prevention Policy and a renewed training and new background check every three years
- Sign and return to staff a statement verifying that they have read, understand and will abide by Shandon UMC's Child Abuse Prevention Policy and Procedures to Reduce Risk and Abuse

Copies of Policy Key Points, Reporting Procedures, and Report Forms, as well as a list of approved volunteer workers, are in wall slots in halls and areas where children are cared for. Substitutes and "fill-in" workers with children must be on this list.
