Where is Jesus?

DISCARD JESUS AND YOU'VE NOT ONLY FOOLISHLY REPLACED THE ONE TRUE GOD WITH IDOLS OF YOUR OWN MAKING; YOU'VE ALSO CUT OFF THE BRANCH ON WHICH YOU SIT AS A POLITICAL ACTOR. -MIROSLAV VOLF

*Is Jesus at the center
Yes ... No ... Maybe?*

A while back, Miroslav Volf, one of America's leading theologians, who teaches at Yale Divinity School, wrote a column in the *Christian Century* which he entitled "Leaving Jesus Behind" (yes, there is an allusion to the famous "Left Behind" series). Volf laments that much of American Christianity today – both conservative and liberal – has "left Jesus behind."

He writes that many Christians:

hardly ever talk about Jesus, at least not in public. They talk about politics – how to get their people elected to local, state and federal governments so as to advance their religious, moral and political causes. They pour their energy into political battles and have none left for Jesus. If you were to point this out to them, they'd vehemently disagree, telling you that they wage political wars for Jesus and in his name. But Jesus is no longer at the center of their attention. The struggle for power has taken his place. They are political warriors in religious garb, not followers of Jesus.

The clergy, he writes, are part of the problem rather part of the solution:

I've sat through many sermons that were all about this or that cause, and about how this or that social or psychic technique will solve the problem if only we would roll up our sleeves. It is not that I disliked the causes on the whole, but I kept wondering, Where is Jesus in all this? At best I could hear distant echoes of the spirit of Jesus translated into a modern idiom. Social causes were garnering our respect, not the concrete person Jesus.

As a new school year starts, summer vacations end, and renewed energy begins to pulsate through the church; as we move deeper into an election year; as the United Methodist Church prays for God to show us the way into God's future; we would do well to ask ourselves Volf's question – "Where is Jesus in all this?" Is our life in the world just about politics? Is church just a place where we hang out with nice people like us? Is the most exciting day of our week Saturday, when we worship at the temples of Williams Brice, Death Valley, etc.?

I pray that for those of us who call ourselves disciples, Jesus matters more than any of these things! I pray that Jesus has his rightful place at the center of our hearts and minds, and that our lives are true reflections of his beauty, grace and truth.

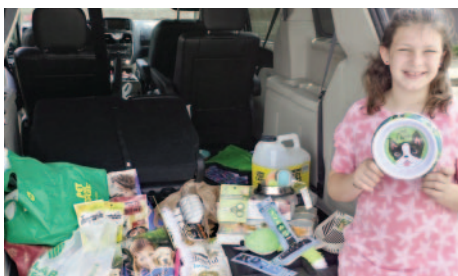

SHANDON'S CHILD & YOUTH ABUSE PREVENTION PROCEDURES

Reminder of the Month: Requirements for Volunteers with Children and Youth

Before working with children or youth, all volunteer church workers must:

- be a SUMC member or actively involved at SUMC for at least six months.
- attend a training session and sign a statement that they have been trained, have read, understand, and will abide by this Policy and the Procedures to Reduce Risk and Abuse for both children and youth.
- pass a National Background Check, a Social Security Verification Check, and a SLED criminal records check. Rechecks will be every three years.
- complete and sign a Volunteer Application, listing three non-related references

Copies of Policy Key Points, Reporting Procedures, and Report Forms, as well as a list of approved volunteer workers, are in wall slots in halls and areas where children are cared for. Substitutes and "fill-in" workers with children must be on this list.
